## **Hudson Valley Lighting Group Launches Spring Collections with Brands Hudson Valley Lighting and Corbett Lighting**

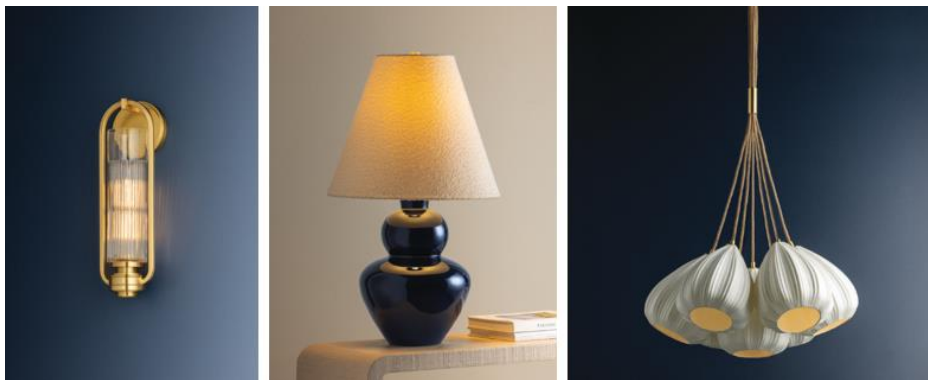
*HVLG spring collections following themes of French Farmstead and New Bohemian*

**Wappingers Fall, NY (April 23, 2026)** - [Hudson Valley Lighting Group](#) (HVLG) announces the launch of its Spring 2026 collections from brands [Hudson Valley Lighting](#) and [Corbett Lighting](#), debuting April 23, 2026, with the collections making their first public appearance at High Point Market this weekend.

Hudson Valley Lighting, the group's flagship brand, will debut a new collection inspired by the enduring appeal of the French Farmstead aesthetic. Emerging in response to the continued resurgence of Modern Farmhouse design, this collection presents a more elevated, nuanced interpretation, with a sub theme of modern sanctuary.

This Spring's collection will encompass 42 new SKUs with one line extension from the Hayworth family. Blending traditional design principles with indulgent materials, consumers will find pieces elevated with lux glass and crystal, antique finishes, and delicate botanical shapes, resulting in pieces that feel both timeliness and current.

Rich, fashion-forward textiles, layered patterns, and a curated palette of soft neutrals and warm tones further enhance the collection's sense of depth and character.

Corbett Lighting debuts its Spring collection with a richly layered point of view, exploring two distinct yet complementary themes: New Bohemian and Luxe Elemental. Together, these narratives highlight the brand’s signature balance of artistry and innovation, blending expressive forms with elevated materials to create lighting that feels both sculptural and atmospheric.

The New Bohemian direction embraces a sense of romance and organic movement. Designs like Milos reinterpret classic Italian glasswork with cascading tiers of luminous droplets, while Innsbruck and Pedrillo draw from nature with floral silhouettes and handcrafted textures. Pieces such as Mostar and Cadiz introduce a quieter elegance, pairing artisanal materials and tailored forms to create soft, ambient light with a distinctly modern sensibility.

In contrast, Luxe Elemental explores structure, geometry, and materiality through a more architectural lens. From the sweeping, sculptural arms of Frankfurt to the alabaster glow of Lausanne and Augustin, each design emphasizes form and illumination as a unified experience. Statement pieces like Istanbul and Parigi bring a jewelry-like approach to lighting, while designs such as Hydra and Konstanze introduce bold, graphic elements. The result is a collection that feels at once expressive and refined, pushing the boundaries of decorative lighting while maintaining a sense of timeless sophistication.

“This spring, we approached Hudson Valley Lighting and Corbett Lighting as two distinct expressions of our design process,” shared SVP of Product Design and Development, Jennifer Dubas. “For HVL, it was about refining familiar forms through materiality, proportion, and a softer, more nuanced palette, while Corbett offered a more expressive exploration of sculptural shapes, organic movement, and the interplay of light and texture. Across both, the process was hands-on and iterative, with a focus on how materials

perform and how each piece feels in a space, creating designs that feel thoughtful, layered, and forward-looking while remaining rooted in our core language.”
